We're a Christian non-profit based in Minnesota that welcomes and serves all people! We buy raw ingredients for nutritious meals, designed by food scientists to reverse and prevent malnutrition. Then each year, 500,000 volunteers like you pack the rice, soy nuggets, dried vegetables and vitamins into shippable "MannaPack" pouches, shipped free to mission partners and agencies that help people in 70 countries around the world. Feed my starving children is sending at least 600,000 MannaPack meals to Japan to help after the Tsunami.
